**Report on the Standalone Financial Statements**

### Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of **ECO GREEN BREEDERS PRIVATE LIMITED** ("the company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31<sup>st</sup> March 2024, the Statement of Profit and Loss for the period from 01<sup>st</sup> April 2023 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2024, and notes to the financial statement, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid standalone financial statements, give the information required by The Companies Act 2013 in the manner so required and give a **TRUE AND FAIR** view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India;

- In the case of the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the Company as at 31<sup>st</sup> March 2024;
- In the case of the Statement of Profit and Loss, of the Loss for the year ended on that date.

### Basis For Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing specified under section 143(10) of The Companies Act 2013. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion on the financial statements.



### Key Audit Matters

Key audit matters are those matters that, in our professional judgment, were of most significance in audit of the financial statements of the current period. These matters were addressed in the context of our audit of the financial statements as a whole, and in forming our opinion thereon, and we do not provide a separate opinion on these matters. We have determined that there are no such key audit matters to be reported.

### Information Other Than the Standalone Financial Statements and Auditor's Report Thereon

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the preparation of the other information comprising the information included in the Management Discussion and Analysis, Board's Report including Annexure to Board's Report and Shareholder's Information, but does not include the standalone financial statements and our auditor's report thereon.

Our opinion on the standalone financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the standalone financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the standalone financial statements or our knowledge obtained during the course of our audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

If, based on the work we have performed, we have nothing to report in this regard.

### Responsibilities Of Management & Those Charged with Governance for The Standalone Financial Statements

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the matters stated in section 134(5) of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") with respect to the preparation of these standalone financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position and financial performance of the Company in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Act. This responsibility also includes the maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provision of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting the frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, the Board of Directors is responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going



concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Board of Director either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so. Those Board of Directors are also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

### **Auditor's Responsibilities for The Audit of The Financial Statements**

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material statement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high-level assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as a going concern.

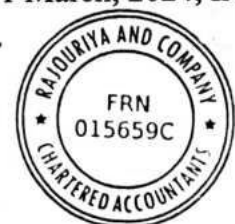

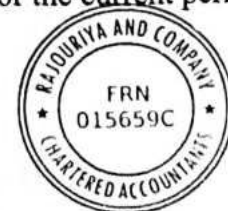

NOTES ON ACCOUNTS

### 1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES :

#### A) Basis of preparation of Financial Statements

##### a) Method of Accounting

These financial statements have been prepared to comply with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in India , including the Accounting Standards notified under the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013. GAAP comprises mandatory Accounting standard as Prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act,2013 read with rule 7 of companies (Accounts) rules, 2014.

#### C) Cash flow statement

The cash flow statement is not prepared because it is not applicable as per the limits specified.

#### D) Valuation of Inventories :

Inventories are valued at Cost or Market Price whichever is lower.

#### E) Fixed Assets :

i) Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition less accumulated depreciation and impairment loss, if any, where cost is inclusive of duties, taxes, incidental expenses erection / commissioning expenses and preliminary expenses till date of commencement of production and all necessary expenses to bring the asset to its working condition.

#### F) Depreciation :

Depreciation is provided based on useful life of the assets as prescribed in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013.

#### G) Investment :

Investment are classified as Current Investments and Long Term Investments based on intention of the management at the time of purchase. Current investments are stated at the lower of the cost and fair value and long term investments are stated at cost.

- 3) Deffered Tax is recognized on timing difference between the accounting income and the taxable income for the year and quantified using the tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted as on the balance sheet date. Deffered tax assets are recognised and carried forward to the extent there is reasonable certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deffered tax assets can be realized.
- 4) Minimum alternate Tax (MAT) credit is recognised as an asset only when and to the extent there is convincing evidence that the company will pay income tax higher than the computed under MAT, during the period under which MAT is permitted to be set off under applicable laws.
- 5) In the year in which MAT credit become eligible to be recognised as an asset in accordance with recommendation contained in the guidance Note issued by the Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI), the said asset is created by way of a credit to the statement of profit and loss account shown as MAT credit entitlement. The company reviews the same at each Balance sheet date and writes down the carrying Amount of MAT credit entitlement to the extent there is longer convincing evidence to the effect that company will pay Income tax higher than MAT during the specified period.

#### **M) Research and Development**

Revenue expenditure on research and development is charged to Statement of Profit and loss for the year.



**N) Contingent Liability :**

Liabilities which are material and whose future outcome can not ascertained with reasonable certainty are treated as contingent and disclosed by way of notes to the accounts.

**O) Foreign Currency Transactions**

(a) Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are recorded at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of the transaction or that approximates the actual rate at the date of the transaction.

(b) Any income or expense on account of exchange difference either on settlement or on translation is recognised in the Profit and Loss account except in case of long term liabilities, where they relate to acquisition of fixed assets, in which case they are adjusted to the carrying cost of such assets.

**E) Revenue Recognition:**

Revenues from sale of goods are recognized when risks and rewards of ownership of goods are passed on to the customers, which are generally on dispatch of goods and are recorded net of taxes and duties.
